**As a Certificate of Competency Holder, you are fully responsible for:**

- 1) Knowing your certification is ONLY valid when used for the legal employer listed upon it as reflected in your legal certification record with the Washington State Patrol Fire Protection Bureau.
- 2) Knowing your certification number. It does not change annually and you are obligated to sign all work you perform with this number as it is listed on your certification and shown on our certification lists.
- 3) Working within and being fully aware of the scope of your certification level. Working beyond the scope of your level is considered working without certification, which is a violation of law and rule.
- 4) Notifying this office within thirty (30) days of leaving the legal employer listed upon your certification. You are required to do so by law, effectively suspended the moment you leave, and MUST transfer the certification to another licensed employer before continuing to work.
- 5) The use of your certification and the certification number issued to you. Only a certified individual can use their certification number and/or the associated certification seal/stamp (ITT's have no stamp).
- 6) Understanding the certification renewal process and knowing when your certification(s) expire. It is your responsibility to renew prior to expiration and properly follow the renewal procedure. All renewal notices are sent to the legal employer listed on your certification for tracking and distribution.
- 7) Keeping your certification active. Simply submitting a renewal – whether to your employer or this office – and waiting until weeks or months after the expiration date to ask about your status is not sufficient. If you do not have a currently valid certificate you are not currently legal.
- 8) Knowing and understanding laws and rules associated with your certification. RCW 18.160 and RCW 18.270 both certify individuals working for licensed contractors and use WAC 212-80 for their governing rule set. HOWEVER, each law has dominion over different aspects of work and you are responsible for knowing the differences, which certifications you hold, their specific scope of work, and what expectations exist from each. Especially if you possess certification under both laws.
- 9) Notifying the relevant authorities of any violation you witness or are asked to take part in. As a Certificate of Competency Holder certified under RCW 18.160, you are given legal permission to work in a restricted/regulated fire and life safety trade. If you knowingly see something illegal or even inappropriate you have a responsibility to report it. If the Authority Having Jurisdiction does not know about it, it cannot be enforced corrected.

- 1) You are required by law to notify this office within thirty (30) days of changing employers.
- 2) You are required by law and rule to carry this certification card with you at all times and evidence it upon command.
- 3) This card must be current to be valid or used. It is not perpetual.

- 1) You have six (6) months or until next renewal cycle (whichever occurs last) to replace your only certificate holder. However, you can do no new jobs, designs, or change orders. Only complete active phases for already approved plans using properly skilled/certified employees.
- 2) For specialized licensing, your license is considered suspended the moment you lose all of your specialized certificate holders as they are conditional for the only work you are allowed to perform.
- 3) Though not obligated by law, it is in your best interest to notify us when losing a certificate holder so the certification can be suspended and removed from your company's license. Until we are notified otherwise, they are legally your employee and work under your licensing and bond.
