The Nisqually Indian Tribe's THPO has reviewed the Notice of Application and supplemental materials that you provided for the above named project and requests that a cultural resources survey be required as part of the Pierce College 10 year master plan.

The mapped "Future Projects" amount to a substantial loss of natural area in which cultural resources may be irrevocably damaged. A cultural resources survey would allow the affected Tribes and concerned citizens/historical societies a glimpse into the history of this area and facilitate discussions related to future mitigation measures if needed. Please keep us informed if there are any Inadvertent Discoveries of Archaeological Resources/Human Burials.
