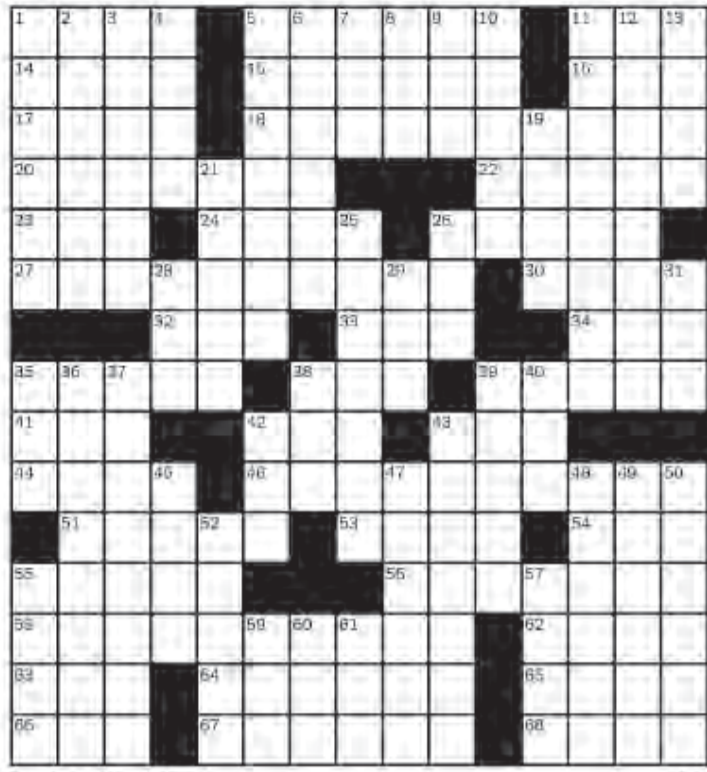

But people do exist who can be part of a couple without having to check phones for proof of fidelity. And this is how they do it: They trust themselves to get through whatever life throws at them, more or less. Even a betrayal.

Tuesday's Top 25

No. 14 Texas Tech 77, No. 23 Texas 64: Kevin Obanor had 17 points with five 3-pointers, and Texas Tech defeated Texas in Chris Beard's return to an emotionally charged arena packed with fans who used to love the coach who took the Red Raiders to the national championship game only three years ago. When Beard left the South Plains 10 months ago to become coach at his alma mater, and their most-hated rival, Red Raid-

ers fans immediately started pointing to this chance to let him hear how they felt. It was raucous in the arena long before tipoff in the game to wrap up the first half of the Big 12 schedule, and stayed that way through the end of the victory that kept them undefeated at home. Kevin McCullar had 19 points, while Bryson Williams added 16 points and Davion Warren 10 for the Red Raiders. Marcus Carr had 16 points to lead Texas. No. 1 Auburn 100, Alabama 81: Wendell Green Jr. scored a season-high 23 points off the bench for Auburn. Jabari Smith added 17

points as Auburn extended the nation's longest winning streak to 18. Jaden Shackelford led Alabama with 26 points. No. 10 Kansas 70, No. 21 Iowa State 61: David McCormack scored 14 points, and Jalen Wilson had 13 rebounds for Kansas. Izaiah Brockington led Iowa State with 24 points. No. 13 Michigan State 65, Maryland 63: Malik Hall made a driving layup with 1.9 seconds left, and Michigan State survived a second-half rally by Maryland. Hall led the Spartans with 16 points, and Joey Hauser and Marcus Bingham Jr. had 10 apiece.

Eric Ayala scored 15 points and Donta Scott had 14 for Maryland. No. 15 Providence 86, St. John's 82: Jared Bynum scored 19 points and Al Durham made eight straight free throws in the final 27 seconds for Providence. Nate Watson scored 15 of his 16 points in the second half for the Friars. Posh Alexander had 29 points and 12 assists for the Red Storm. Creighton 59, No. 17 UConn 55: Ryan Hawkins scored 23 points for Creighton. Isaiah Whaley had a career-high 20-points for UConn. No. 22 Tennessee 90

Texas A&M 80: Kennedy Chandler scored 16 points, and Olivier Nkamhoua added 15 for Tennessee. Josiah-Jordan James and Zakai Zeigler each scored 14 points and Santiago Vescovi added 13. Texas A&M was led by Wade Taylor IV with 19 points. Mississippi 76, No. 25 LSU 72: Mississippi's Daeshun Ruffin scored 19 points before leaving the game in the second half because of an apparent leg injury. Luis Rodriguez scored 15 for Ole Miss. Darius Days scored 21 for LSU. Tari Eason and Eric Gaines each scored 16 for reeling Tigers.

UConn pays Ollie \$11.1 million: The University of Connecticut said Tuesday it has complied with a recent arbitration ruling and has paid former men's basketball coach Kevin Ollie more than \$11.1 million. Arbitrator Mark Irving ruled last month that Ollie had been fired improperly under the school's agreement with the American Association of University Professors, of which Ollie was a member. He noted the school had past NCAA violations in the men's and women's programs without going as far as firing the coaches. — ASSOCIATED PRESS

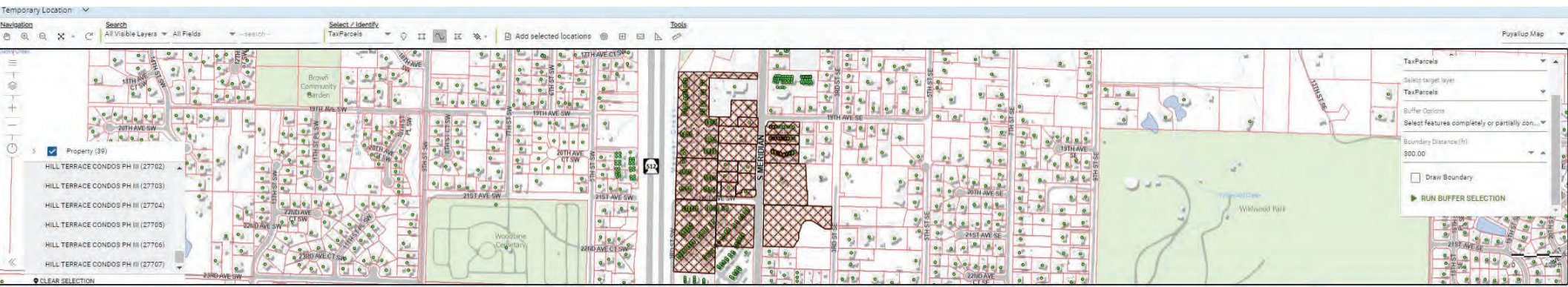
No. 20 Notre Dame 69, No. 3 N.C. State 66: Maya Dodson had 20 points and grabbed 10 rebounds, her fourth double-double of the season, for Notre Dame. Freshman Olivia Miles had 13 points and reserve Sam Brunelle had 10 points off the bench to give second-year Irish coach Niele Ivey her biggest victory since taking over for Hall of Fame coach Muffet McGraw, who was in attendance. The fourth straight victory by Notre Dame ended the nine-game winning streak by Wes Moore's Wolfpack, who lost their first game in the league. Diamond Johnson came off the bench to lead N.C. State with 16 points, 14 in the second half, while senior All-American Elissa Cunane finished with just 13 points and seven points while playing with four fouls in the fourth quarter. Jakia Brown-Turner added

11 for N.C. State. No. 4 Louisville 69, Miami 66: Kianna Smith had 21 points and Olivia Cochran scored the go-ahead basket for Louisville. Cochran finished with 18 points, including her layup with 32 seconds remaining. Ja'Leah Williams had 16 points and Destiny Harden finished with 13 for the Hurricanes. No. 12 Georgia Tech 59, Duke 46: Lorela Cubaj had 15 points and seven rebounds, and Eyllia Love added 14 points and eight rebounds for Georgia Tech. Lotta-Maj Lahtinen and Nerea Hermosa each scored 10 points for Georgia Tech. Shayean Day-Wilson scored 17 points and Lexi Gordon added 11 for Duke. No. 19 Oregon 72, Arizona State 58: Nyara Sabally scored 22 points, and Te-Hina Paopao had 19 points, six rebounds and six assists for Oregon. Endyia Rogers added 10 points for Oregon. Mael Gilles led Arizona State with 16 points, seven rebounds and five assists. — ASSOCIATED PRESS

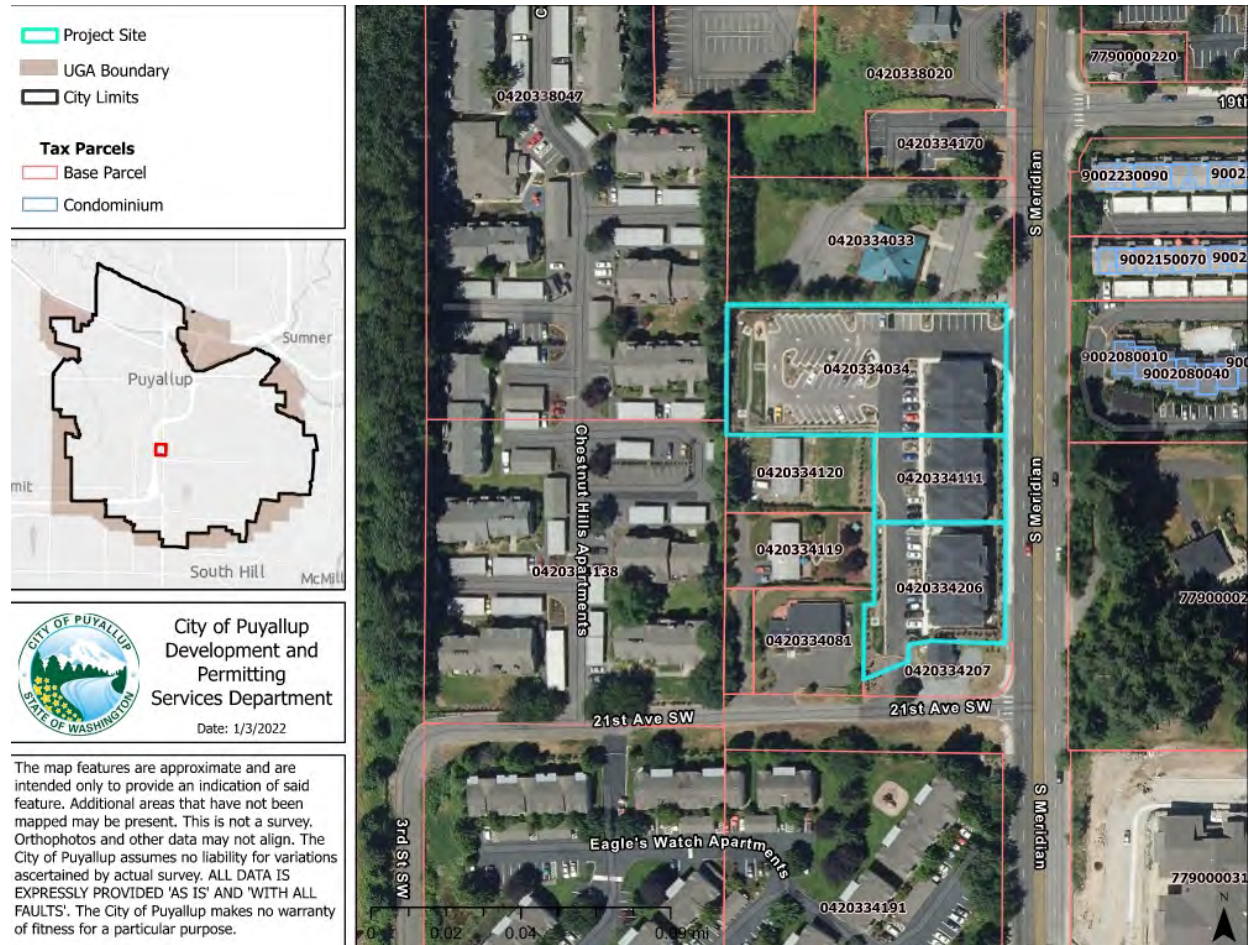

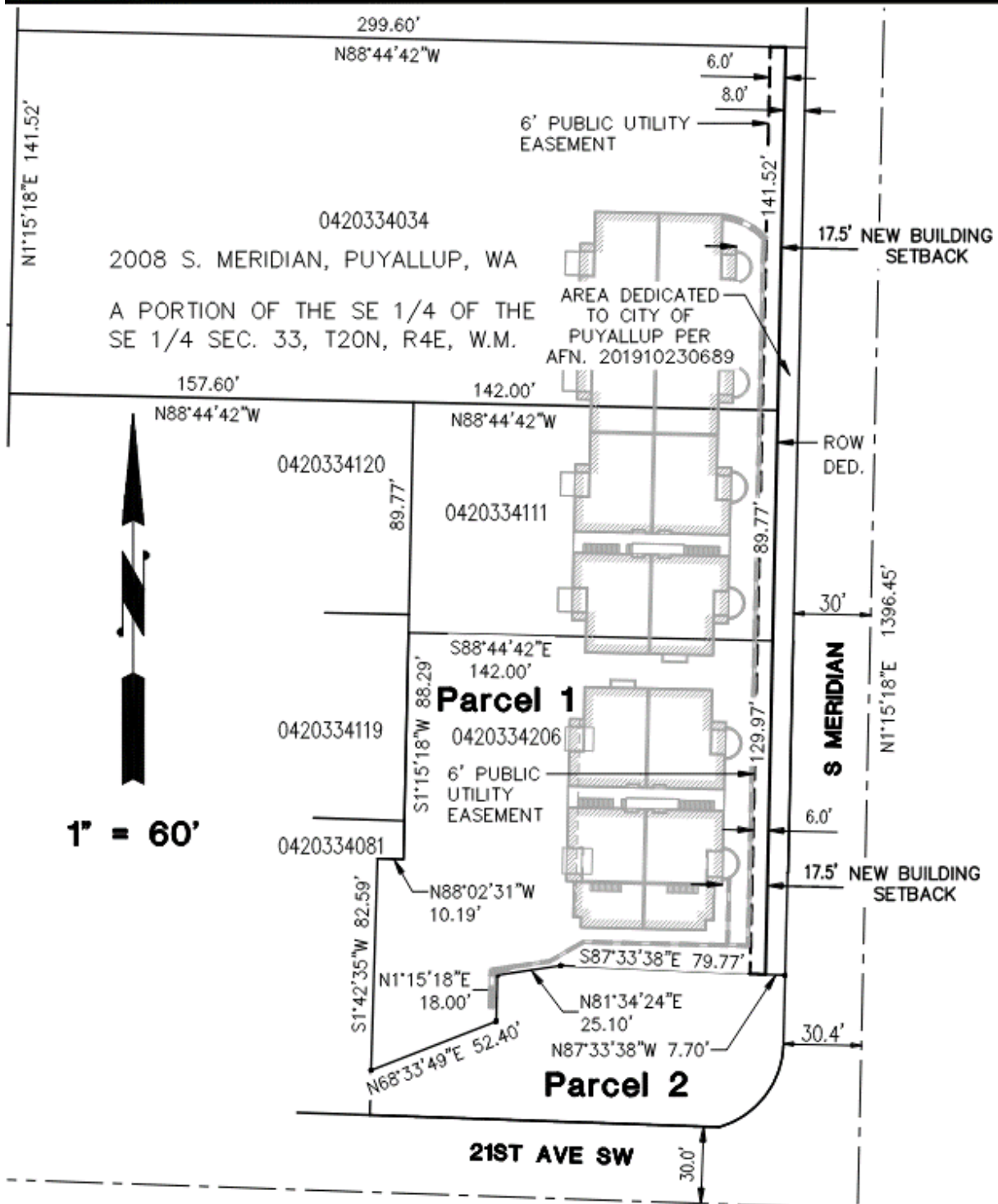

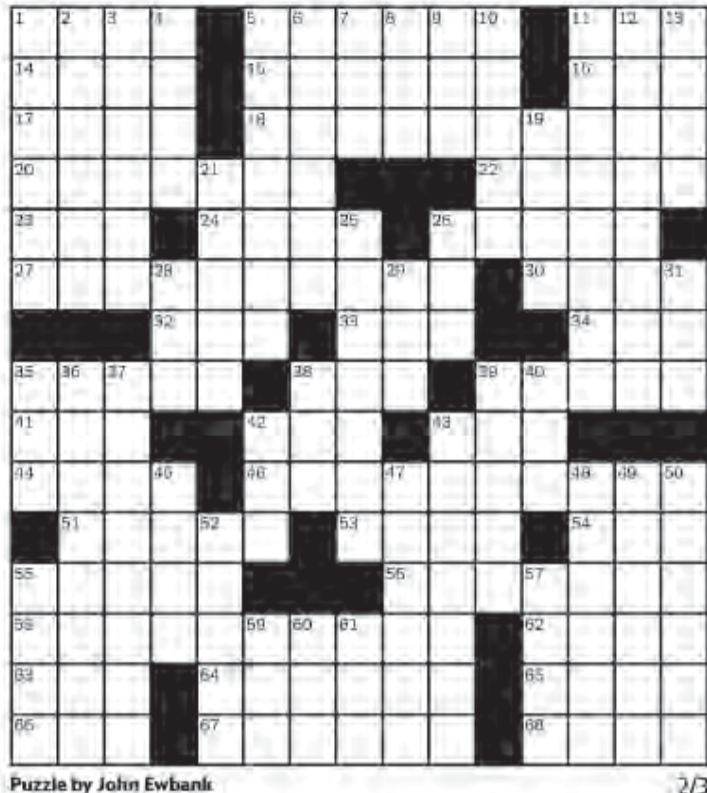
Site Plan
