



REVIEW CRITERIA – PUYALLUP REGISTER

01

It is significantly associated with the history, architecture, archaeology, engineering, or cultural heritage of the community;

02

It has integrity;

03

It is at least 50 years old or is of lesser age and has exceptional importance; and 04

It falls in at least one of the following categories: (...)

STAFF ANALYSIS

- 1. Significance. Architecture, use and rural community history
- 2. Integrity. Maintained historic integrity
- 3. Building age. More than 50 years old
- 4. Falls under three categories:
 - a) Embodies distinctive architectural features
 - b) Exemplifies special elements of city's cultural, social and economic history
 - c) Associated with someone significant to area's history

BOARD RECOMMENDATION

The Board recommends **approval** (4-0) to City Council for the "Harris Building" historic register listing nomination due to findings consistency with the required criteria

COUNCIL ACTION

- 1. **Approve** the request and first reading of an ordinance, consistent with the Board recommendation; or
- 2. Modify the Board recommendation; or
- **3. Reject** the Board's recommendation and deny the request. *New findings are necessary to support denial*; or,
- 4. Remand back to the Board for further consideration.
